Lion Glenn joined the Vancouver Chinatown Lions Club in December 2000 and in the Lion year “2008-2009”, he is prepared to fully serve the Lions of Zone A1, the largest Zone in District 19A as their facilitator and Zone Chairman. As a graduate of the Lions Clubs International Emerging Lions Leadership Institute in Chicago, he has served in many positions at the different levels and chaired many committees and projects.
